Superintendent appoints Young as new Coriscana ISD Deputy Superintendent

Dr. Joe Young was elevated to deputy superintendent at Monday's regular Corsicana ISD Board meeting.

Dr. Young had previously been the Assistant Superintendent for Special Programs, a position he held during the 2010-11 school year. He previously was the district's athletic director since coming to the district in 2008.

"Dr. Young's new position as Deputy Superintendent expands his supervision and leadership to additional programs within the district," said Superintendent Dr. Diant Frost. "He will support the

Superintendent by providing direction and supervision to all departments regarding implementation of federal, state and local laws, regulations, guidelines, and policies to ensure district compliance.

"A significant part of this position will be the review of processes and procedures in order to streamline communication and to ensure that interdepartmental communication is more effective."

Dr. Young came to Corsicana from Grapeland High

School where he was principal. Young holds his doctorate from Sam Houston State University and a bachelor's degree from Texas A&M.

"Dr. Frost and Mr. (Don) Denbow, along with the rest of the CISD community, have been very good to me," Dr. Young said. "I have always cared deeply about students and staff, and the past few years have taught me to merge that more successfully with administrative duties.

"I am honored at the opportunity to work with more programs within the district to help our kids, teachers, and administrators."

In other board news . . . The board approved the Student Code of Conduct for the 2011-12 school year . . . The board also adopted a Police Operations Manual, which will establish clear policies and procedures for the CISD Police Department . . . The board heard a report on the 2011-12 budget from Assistant Superintendent Mike Nielsen. The proposed budget is \$35,450,076, which is about 7 percent less than last year's budget and alligns the district with cuts from the state. Nielsen also outlined the proposed tax rate, which will remain unchaged at \$1.283. The board will approve the 2011-12 budget and the tax rate at a special meeting at 6 p.m. on Aug. 29 . . . The board accepted a check for \$3,316 from the Corsicana Booster Club to be used for a Volleyball Sport Attack Machine.
