Emergency situations may arise at any time during athletic events. Immediate action must be taken in order to provide the best possible care to the athlete of the emergency/life threatening condition. In the event that a person suffers a serious illness or injury that requires Emergency Medical Services the following plan should be followed.

## **Components of the Emergency Action Plan:**

- A. Emergency Response Team
- B. Emergency Equipment
- C. Important Phone Numbers
- D. Facilities & Directions

## A. Emergency Response Team:

- Certified Athletic Trainer Athletic Director/Athletic Coordinator -Head Coaches
- Stadium Manager/Police Officer Principal EMT Assistant Coaches

# **Roles within the Emergency Response Team**

#### 1. Establish scene safety and immediate care of the athlete

Acute care in an emergency situation should be provided with the most qualified individual on the scene. Individuals with lower credentials should yield to those with more appropriate training.

# 2. Activation of the Emergency Action Plan

This should be done as soon as the situation is deemed an emergency or a life-threatening event. Activating the EMS system will be done by the certified athletic trainer unless delegated otherwise.

When calling 911 the following information will need to be provided:

- 1. Name of caller
- 2. Address
- 3. Condition of injured
- 4. Description of first aid treatment given to injured
- 5. Specific directions
- 6. Any other information requested

#### 3. Emergency equipment retrieval

Supplies include AED, splint bag, spine board, and/or any other piece of equipment that may be obtained from athletic training room. Emergency equipment should be available in close proximity to practice or competition site (i.e. sideline/dugout). As the certified athletic trainer acts as first responder, a student athletic trainer will be responsible for retrieving supplies.

#### 4. Direction of EMS to scene

In most cases the assigned CISD Police Officer will be responsible for meeting the emergency medical personnel as they arrive at the site of the emergency. They will also be responsible for unlocking any gates/doors that lead to the site of incident so it is imperative that they have appropriate keys. In the event that there is not an assigned CISD Police Officer on duty, the certified athletic trainer will select another member of the emergency response team to complete this task. The other members will be an assistant coach of the assigned sport.

#### **B.** Emergency Equipment


The sports medicine staff should be familiar with the functionality and operation of each type of emergency equipment. Equipment should be in proper working order. Emergency equipment should be checked on a regular basis and rehearsed by emergency personnel regularly. Emergency equipment should include splint bag, spine board, AED oxygen bag, crutch bag, etc.
