

Discipline and Grading Policy for Kasprzyk's PreAP and AP Physics Classes

Class Rules

AP tests are time limited, require formula memorization. This is to prepare for and model the actual AP testing experience.

Supplies Needed:

Spiral Notebook

A 3-subject spiral notebook should be ok, but you may use multiple small ones as needed. Spirals are for your notes and assignments. Composition notebooks are not recommended.

AP Classes will need a folder to compile labs in. It should at least have brads. This may be used for presentation to colleges and universities for lab credit.

Something to write with is a must, but I am flexible as to whether it is pen or pencil. Pen colors should be blue or black.

Calculators are provided in class, but it is recommended that students have a calculator for homework. TI30-XIIS, TI 83, 84 are some suggestions. Some math classes issue calculators for students to use at home, also there are free and inexpensive smart phone apps available.
