RE: AP TESTING UPDATE

Dear AP Student/Parent:

As you know, College Board is moving forward with AP testing this year amid the coronavirus crisis. AP exams are scheduled for **May 11th – 25th**. Each student can take their AP Exam online at home using any device they have access to—computer, tablet, or smartphone. Students will also have the option to write their responses by hand and submit a photo.

The exams are 45 minutes long and are open book and open note. To be fair, the exams will only include topics and skills most AP teachers and students have already covered in class by early March. Most exams will have one or two free-response questions, and each question is timed separately. Students who need a device and internet connectivity should notify their AP teacher before April 20th.

Students should stay connected with their AP teacher weekly for AP assignments and access the free AP Online classes and Review Sessions provided by College Board to prepare for the exams. Late testing is scheduled for June 1-5. You should check the exam schedule now and plan to take your exam on the primary date. Notify your AP teacher immediately if you have a conflict with your testing date. All "late testing" request must be approved by the Advanced Academics Coordinator prior to testing.

In late April, College Board will provide AP students and educators with an At-Home Testing guide that will include information on how to access the testing system on test day and video demonstrations so that students can familiarize themselves with the system. You will receive notification when this information becomes available.

Continue to check your email for updates from College Board. I have included the full exam schedule and the FAQ link with this letter for your review.
