



Eligibility for Prekindergarten

This page explains the eligibility rules and requirements for prekindergarten. It also provides the required documentation for eligible students.

Eligibility Requirements

A district is required to offer a prekindergarten program if they identify 15 or more eligible children who are at least four years of age by September of the current school year and meet one of the criteria listed below. Age is always calculated as of September 1 of the current school year (for the purposes of establishing eligibility).

- Be unable to speak and comprehend the English language;
- Be educationally disadvantaged, which means a student eligible to participate in the national free or reduced-price lunch program;
- Be homeless, as defined by 42 United States Codes (U.S.C.) Section 1143a, regardless of the residence of the child, of either parent of the child, or of the child's guardian or other person having lawful control of the child;
- Be the child of an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state military forces or a reserve component of the armed forces, who is ordered to active duty proper authority;
- Be the child of a member of the armed forces of the United States, including the state military forces or a reserve component of the armed forces, who was injured or killed while serving on active duty;
- Be in, or have been in, the conservatorship of the Department of the Family and Protective Service(DFPS) following an adversary hearing held as provided by Section 262.201, Family Code: firefighter (3106.003), or emergency medical first responder (3106.0044).

Should a student not qualify for Pre-K under the state guidelines, a tuition will be charged.
