Corsicana High School's 2023-2024 enrollment is 1,820 students; 482 freshman, 464 sophomores, 503 juniors, and 372 seniors. Seventy Two percent of our students are economically disadvantaged. Our student body consists of the following ethnicities with their respective percentage of student body: Hispanic- 55%; White- 23%; Black- 15%; Pacific Islander-3%; Asian- .65%; Multiple Ethnicities- 3%; American Indian .27%. CHS has a staff of 180 employees, one principal, one associate principal, four assistant principals, 3 coordinators, 2 LPC's and six counselors.
